HOME SCHOOLING FOR CHILDREN IN CUSTODY

POLICY

The Tuscarawas County Job & Family Services decides on a case-by-case basis if a child in custody may be home-schooled by his/her foster caregiver.

Any home-schooling program used by a foster caregiver must be approved by the public school district in which the caregiver resides.

PROCEDURE

- 1. The child's foster caregiver submits a written request to the agency to provide home schooling.
- 2. The supervisor of the child in custody convenes a meeting of the following persons:
 - a. The child's case manager.
 - b. The foster care worker (if the caregiver is a TCJFS foster home).
 - c. The supervisor of the child in custody.
 - d. The Social Service Department Head.
 - e. The child's parent or custodian (unless the agency holds permanent custody).
 - f. A representative of the child's school district of origin.
- 3. The child's foster caregiver.
- 4. The child's case manager records this team's recommendation and forwards it to the Director for approval or denial.
- 5. The child's case manager conveys the Director's approval or denial to the members of this team.
- 6. The foster caregiver's request, the team's recommendation, and the Director's response are filed in the child's case record.
